Austin Reesor approached his friend Arthur Lapp with the idea of developing a natural ice arena, and with a handshake, the property became part of the Cedar Grove Community Club. Cedarena formally opened with a hockey game on January 29, 1927. A fancy-dress carnival followed 10 days later and the rink caught on. In the early 1950s, a frame pavilion opened with wood stoves and benches for lacing skates. Outside the pavilion is the
