
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
Existing Context


▼ The DDO property is the last remaining large parcel of vacant lands located within Richmond Hill's settlement area.









































OBSERVATORY LANDS LIMIT OF DESIGNATED CULTURAL HERITAGE LANDSCAPE (DCHL)




VEGETATION GROUPING

VEGETATION GROUPING OUTSIDE DCHL





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

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Planning and Negotiation Process

- Timely Designation of the Cultural Heritage Landscape;
- 2. Council Approved Conservation Management Plan used as a mediation tool:
 - 1. Confirmed the extent of the protected area;
 - 2. Provided guidance on the buffer treatment;
 - 3. Helped identify design approach for the future development in relation to the Cultural Heritage Landscape.
- 3. Identification of 2 Regional Significant Wood Lots and 1 Wetland within the DDO Lands.



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Outcome

- Close to 70% of the property is protected;
- Cultural Heritage Landscape remains intact;
- Protect Natural Heritage;
- Retain the original intent of the DDO lands as a place to be discovered
