

# Organisational Improvement Through International Staff Exchanges

- •129 heritage properties
- Castles, Great Houses and Estates
  - •Mills and Birthplaces
- •200,000 (81,000 Ha)acres of Countryside
  - •394 miles of mountain footpath
  - •248 miles of coastline and 16 islands
    - •35 major gardens

  - •Estonian Heritage Society was established in 1987


At the time it benefited from a benign


neglect. Its historic core still largely intact




Present Estonian internationalism to an uninformed international community

My experiences helped shape this policy - Principle 3


